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The Boards local decision process for new use and bids to additional ACT allocations is supported through quarterly ACT finance and education performance meetings attended By the Medical Director, Director of Medical Education and Assistant Director of Finance. There has been a Divisional restructure within Golden Jubilee National Hospital - the new Divisions are named Heart, Lung and Diagnostics and National Elective Service. 138 The Management Accountant responsible for the Boards Heart Lung & Diagnostics Division manages the finance reports that are circulated monthly to the Director of Medical Education, any plans discussed at the ACT Performance Review Group meetings are also fed through the Divisional performance reviews to ensure that bids and plans proposed for new monies can be supported through the Divisional route and any changes to existing arrangement supported by ACT funding are known and monitored Detail of any new initiatives funded by Medical ACT within the last 12 months NHS Golden Jubilee hosts a number of University of Glasgow Undergraduate Medical School courses including SSCs, Electives and (most important, numerically), the Cardiological component of the CardioNeuro block. These are all Consultant organised and governed, with delivery of sessions by Consultant Surgeons, Cardiologists, Anaesthetists and Radiologists. NCCG doctors have a significant input as well as senior trainees in Cardiac Surgery and Cardiology. ACT funding is used to support via PAs these activities and is monitored and overseen by the Appraisal Process and the DME. Delivery of the bedside teaching by the Clinical Teaching Fellows has been greatly augmented by the addition of a fourth Clinical Teaching Fellow after a successful pilot. All four positions are funded by ACT. Having four senior individuals has been of particular relevance in the COVID pandemic and has allowed us at the Golden Jubilee to continue to produce high quality medical education in more small group scenarios, maintaining a safe learning environment in an appropriately physical distancing situation. Formal and informal feedback over the past year has been excellent. IT access has been partially addressed with the placement of 4 UoG computers but provision of Eduroam remains a problem because of the need for better fibreoptic cabling. This continues to be investigated by E-Health at the Jubilee. Appointment of a Lead GJNH Cardiologist was put on hold during the pandemic. This will be advertised once more in early 2021. As before, we will continue to use 465 appropriate PA allocation to improve Consultant input as Supervisors and role models. Simulation based education (SBE) is a mainstay in Medical Education and has always played an important part of the delivery of the Clinical Cardiology curriculum. We have continued to deliver SBE to allow students to practice clinical skills in realistic settings whilst providing peer review. This has been of particular relevance during the pandemic. Additional hardware in the form of an additional Sim-Man has been ordered. The echocardiography sim session continues to be evaluated very highly. Engagement of the Clinical Fellows in formal Medical Education training has allowed us to develop more innovative methods of delivering the CardioNeuro block. One Fellow in particular has completed an OU course on delivering online education and this has been invaluable during the pandemic as well as in planning for the future. The introduction of student scrubs has been an excellent idea. In a block of c20 students rotating every 2 weeks or so in term time, it has always been challenging to engender a feeling of belonging in these students. Their uniforms make them much more professional and have played a great part in integrating them

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into the team structure at Golden Jubilee.

Finally, the T&S process was promptly and successfully put in place and has helped factor into significantly improved feedback for the placement.

## Section

The GJF continues to host students from the University of Glasgow Medical School throughout the academic year. The bulk of activity is directed at delivering the clinical cardiovascular sciences part of the Cardio/Neuro block. The main thrust of this short block is to allow the students to understand the presentation and management of patients with acute cardiac disease within an Interventional Regional Heart and Lung Centre. They also get to appreciate how the part of the patient pathway impacts on their management at base hospital.

In addition to these undergraduates, GJF hosts students for elective placements and SSC modules.

The curriculum is delivered through a series of lectures, seminars, tutorials, involvement in clinical areas and bedside teaching. An increase in use of both low and high fidelity simulation is being used

GJF bid for additional £106k funding of which £15k was non-recurring. 2 Cardiology PA's were not utilised in 19-20 and the funding was surrendered to the Regional for non-recurring slippage bid opportunities. The remaining additional bid funding was used in agreement with the additional allocation.

We appointed an additional Teaching Fellow as a pilot (non-recurring) in 2018/19 and this has been a major success, allowing more small group and bedside teaching as well as bespoke one-to-one feedback sessions. We would like to make this a recurring addition going forward. An additional value of this post will be to allow delivery of the central CardioNeuro teaching week that was piloted last year.
