² Trainees will each get an opportunity to observe and rehearse scrubbing and gowning up, and must demonstrate the required standard of asepsis.

³ Simulated scenarios will last approximately 15 minutes, with a 40 minute video-assisted debrief. Each trainee will have the opportunity to start a simulated scenario alone, but help will be available if required.

⁴ The aim is for trainees to reach the level of being ready for directly supervised workplace practice. This will only be achieved in the time available if trainees engage with pre-course reading packs and video resources. Each procedural skill workshop will be run with two faculty, allowing each faculty member 40 minutes per trainee. If the appropriate level is not reached during this time, trainees will not be signed off for that particular procedure and will need to seek alternative training opportunities.
