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What is Turas?

Turas was developed by NHS Education for Scotland (NES) to provide a centralised platform for its digital products and services. The platform currently hosts a variety of custom-built applications, including Appraisal, CPD Portfolios, Learn and the Trainee Management System. All applications on the Turas platform benefit from using a single account for sign in, so users will not need to remember a different username and password for each application they wish to access.

What is Turas Learn?

The Learn application is a content and learning management system that hosts learning materials for all health and social care staff and students in Scotland. On Learn users will find learning sites, eLearning modules, learning programmes and courses. The current collection includes resources produced by NHS Education for Scotland, NHS Grampian, NHS Shetland, NHS24, Health Scotland and Angus Council.

Learn statistics: 100K registered users, over 120 learning sites, over 700 eLearning modules

How you can access Turas Learn?

The Learn application can be accessed directly at <u>https://learn.nes.nhs.scot/</u> or from any other Turas Application by clicking on Dashboard at the top right of the screen.

Most NHSScotland staff already have a Turas account for Appraisal or professional portfolios that should be used to sign in to Learn. Others can register for a Turas account from the Learn application.

What you see depends if you are signed in **and** who you are. Once you are signed in you will see content relevant to your health board / organisation and your role. From 'My Learning Record' you can view your complete learning history on Learn and access certificates for completed learning programmes, modules and courses.

Turas Learn is one of the learning platforms used in health and social care in Scotland, other examples are LearnPro and Brightwave. Learners should check with their managers / supervisors / tutors which platform they should use for mandatory or recommended learning.

What can you do on Turas Learn?

- Search and browse for learning resources including eLearning modules and courses
- Return to learning activities that are in progress
- Get personalised recommendations
- Download certificates
- Book face to face courses
- Save your favourite resources for later
- View your learning history
