Immigration Check-in: Collect your Biometric Residence Permit (BRP)

If you've received a letter from the UK Home Office asking you to collect your Biometric Residence Permit (BRP) from a Post Office branch, you can find your named Post Office branch using the branch finder tool. If you've been asked to collect your permit from a specific named Post Office branch, you can find it and its opening hours.

Collect your BRP from a different branch

If you'd prefer to collect your residence permit from another branch that will be more convenient for you, we can redirect it for a small fee.

Choose 'BRP collection' from the options in the Branch Finder to find the nearest authorised branch in your preferred area. Visit the branch to request the redirection and pay the fee. Then return 7 calendar days later to collect your permit.

Following the collection of your Biometric Residence Card, you are required to provide the International Recruitment Unit with proof of right-to-work Share Code generated from https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work

To enable us to verify your right to work in the UK

Clinical Induction and OSCE Exam Preparation

Information Technology


Work Access - You will be provided with PC access, email address and access to systems and software that is necessary for you to undertake work.

Personal Access (Internet and Mobile Phones) - It is your responsibility to engage with internet service and mobile phone providers to sign on to their services at your expense. There are several packages available to suit your needs and finances, please shop around before committing to a contract.

NHS Lanarkshire currently has two staff networks

Finances

National Insurance Number

You require a National Insurance number to work in the UK. If you have a BRP, you might have a National Insurance number already - it will be printed on the back of your BRP if you do.

If you do not have a National Insurance number, you must apply for one if you plan to work. You can only apply when you're in the UK from the website below: https://www.gov.uk/applynational-insurance-number

What you'll need

If you have the following documents, use them when you apply: your passport from any country your Biometric Residence Permit

Accommodation




Frequently Asked Questions
