




Progress+ is here! 8 years to 7 years, 3 levels to 2 levels

- Minor revamp to the curriculum: 11 Domains remain
- Generic syllabus: "Core" for ST1-ST4 and "Specialty" for ST5-ST7

- ST5-ST7 will also have a "Sub-Specialty" syllabus to complete as well (e.g. gen paeds or GRID sub-spec)
- Key capabilities have changed ever so slightly check syllabus documents and familiarise yourself with "new" curriculum

Generic Specialty ST5+ Syllabus




Risr: New name, same game (!) <- click to access

• Remember to double check your correct grade nomenclature if you're switching from old to new curriculum

What Am I? ST4+ or ST5 (C4) guide

- Add training post with "Add Supervisor and Core/Specialty level training post" (1 form per placement i.e new form 4/6 monthly)
- Complete "Supervision Reports (all options)" for:
 - Induction meeting with PDP (Ed sup)
 - Clinical Supervisor Induction Meeting
- Tag "Key capabilities" to your syllabus
 - ST5+ trainees to tag to Generic syllabus and Sub-Specialty syllabus (oh man there's two!)
- By now, old tags and curriculums should have been pulled across to Progress+ and retagged to the new curriculum
- Assessments remain the same (Mini-CEX, CBDs, DOPS etc)

Scones (makes 10)

Dry ingredients:

Self-raising flour 225g

Butter 6og

Caster sugar 30g

Baking powder 1 teaspoon

Pinch of salt

1 egg

Milk full fat ~100mls

- Oven fan 200C

- Mix dry ingredients in a bowl to make a crumble

- Beat the egg separately and add the milk to a volume of

120mls (put 1 tbsp aside for the egg wash)

- Add egg/milk mixture to the crumble to make a wet dough

- Roll out flat to ~3cm thick (don't knead)

- Cut out scones with 8cm cutter (push straight down, don't

twist or they won't rise) and brush with egg wash

- Bake in oven for 10-12mins

- Enjoy with clotted cream and jam
