The General Medical Council (GMC) standards define what makes a good doctor by setting out the professional values, knowledge, skills and behaviours required of all doctors working in the UK. The Good Medical Practice (GMP) has a strong focus on behaviours and values which create respectful, fair and supportive workplaces. The role of leaders in the creation and maintenance of positive working cultures is pivotal.

This interactive workshop will examine the impact that professional behaviour has on patient safety, staff morale and working environments. Participants will be asked to reflect on their current practice and discuss how the guidance might apply day to day.
